TCMG has deep, strong and valuable community roots

- Established in Elizabeth Park's Pond House 91 years ago the 5th Children's Museum opened in USA
- Preschool established 72 years ago--one of oldest and first in US at a Children's Museum, now full-day
- Roaring Brook Nature Center established 70 years ago joined TCMG in 1973



Operating Hours

Museum: 9AM to 4PM week-days, Sat 9AM to 4PM, Sun 11AM to 4PM with occasional evening events

Preschool: 8AM to 5PM week-days

TCMG is an education center, not an entertainment/amusement entity

- Nearly 50% of revenue from delivery of qualified STEM education classes to over 50,000 children in 200-300 schools, libraries and community centers of virtually every town in CT as well as into NY, MA and RI
- o Focus is on children 3 to 13 years old with their parents, caregivers and teachers
- o Hands on learning opportunities not available elsewhere
- Children always under direct supervision of a responsible adult: parent, grandparent, caregiver, teacher or TCM Staff

Engagements of TCMG West Hartford Campus

- o 110,000/yr-130,000/yr
- o 1/3 off-campus, 2/3 on-campus
- 85%-90% from CT Towns, 10%-15% from other states,<1% from other countries
- Top 10 towns surround Hartford (see table)
- Children never allowed outside enclosed region of campus without supervision
- Autos trips: Average of 125 per day with a maximum of 250 and a rare maximum of 350
- School bus trips: Average of 1 to 2 per day with a maximum of 5
