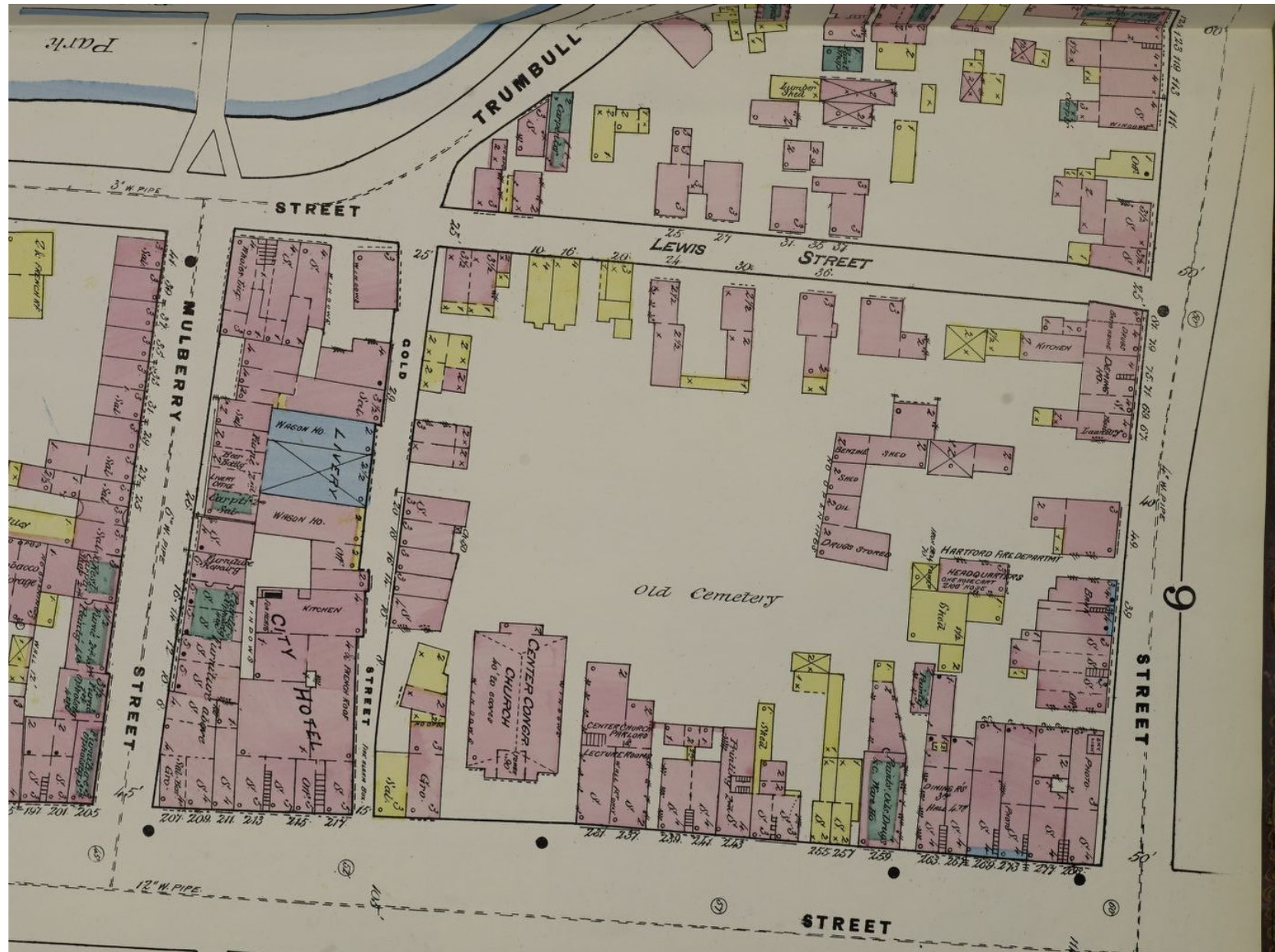

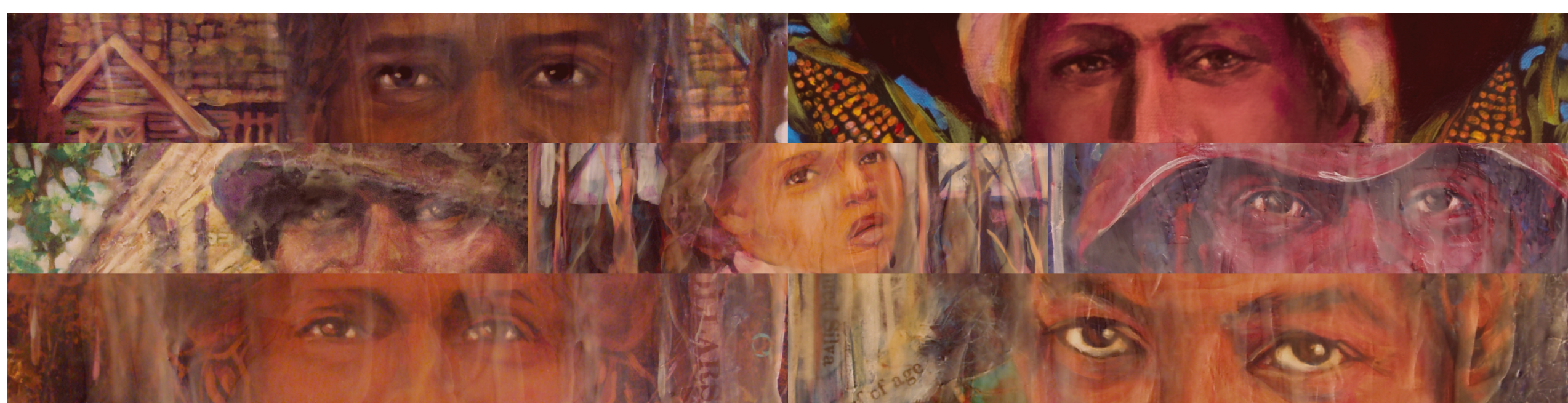

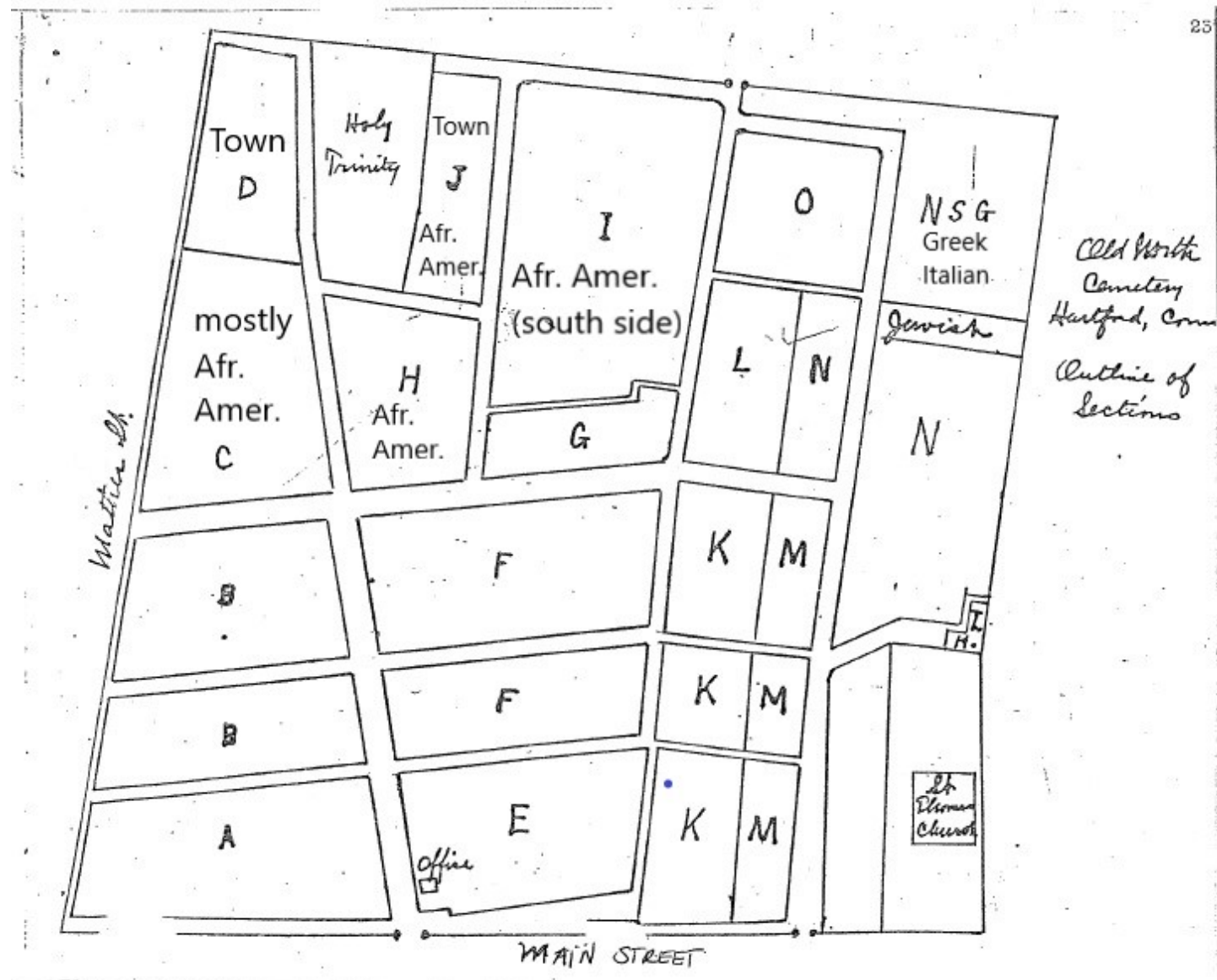


Old North

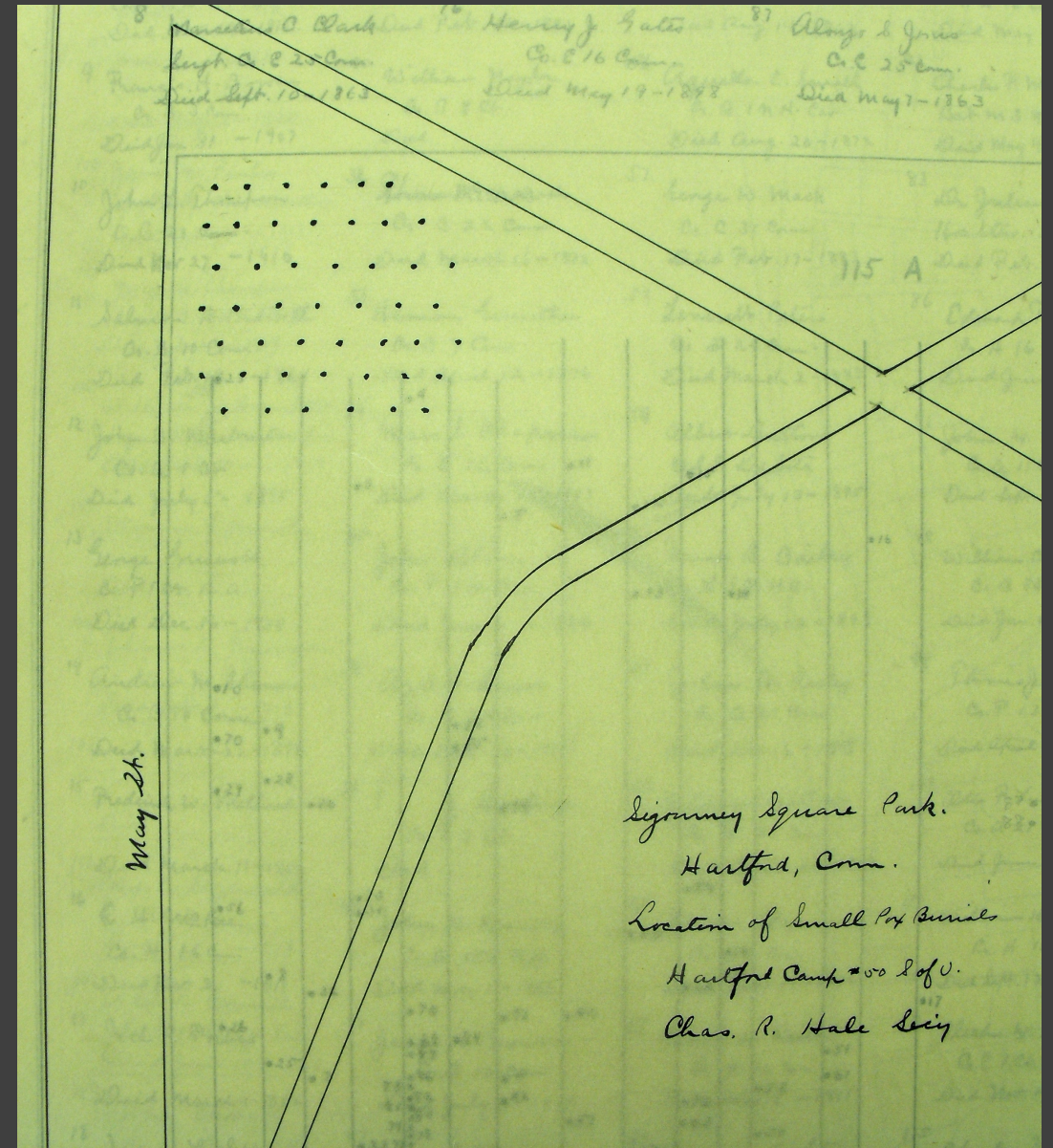
Burial Sites

Recommendations:
