39	This was continuation from the October 21, 2020 Virtual Public Hearing regarding a proposal for the

41 42	Double Hung Tilt Windows. The building is an 1875 Italianate residential home, located in the Frog Hollow National Historic District.

4 4	Ms. Aimee Chambers, Planning Director, gave an update to the earlier report and stated that the				
45	applicant installed the windows prior to going before the Historic Commission to protect his				
46	investment from the intrusion of the elements. She further stated that staff corresponded with the				
47	applicant and that the applicant provided an estimate from Star Hardware for the window				
48	replacements. However, the estimate received does not include the transom window.				
49					
50 ₅₁	The owner/applicant, Mr. Colin Campbell was present and he addressed and answered questions from				
51	the Commission. He stated that in regards to the transom window, he does not have any photos of				
	1				

what it looked like previously. The Commissioners discussed with the applicant the changes that should be made to the transom. There were no comments, questions or testimony from the public and the Public Hearing was closed.

The Commission deliberated, and Commissioner Virginia Seeley made a **MOTION** to **AMEND** the resolution to add the following conditions:

- 1. That the applicant create frames for the windows to sit in that are either 5/4" or 1" in wood; that the frames be installed on the two sides and bottom sill of the rough opening and that it be attached to the corners of the window arch; and that the window be installed tight to that frame and be a lover 1 window.
- 2. That the exterior side of the wood frames in all openings, including the transom, be trimmed with an appropriate standard brick mold detail

Seconded by Commissioner Albert Gary. The **AMENDED** resolution was **APPROVED** with **CONDTIONS** by a vote of **5-0**.

Whereas, The City of Hartford Historic Preservation Commission has reviewed the proposal to remove the existing wood windows, storm panes and window casing on the structure at 23 Babcock Street and replace with vinyl window and wood casing; and

- Whereas, The property is located in the Frog Hollow National Historic District on the block of Babcock Street between Capitol Avenue and Russ Street; and
- Whereas, The structure is an 1875, 3-story brick masonry building of Italianate style in fair condition aside from minor repairs and painting needed on the front entrance porch; and
- Whereas, The applicant proposes to remove all existing wood window and storm window and replace with Series 100 Vinyl Mechanical Double Hung Tilt Window by Crystal Window and door Systems, LTD; and
- Whereas, The proposed white, one over one vinyl windows do not match the existing two over two windows located on the front façade; and
- Whereas, The new wood casing will replace the original wood window casing and the proposed paint color for the wood was not provided; and
- Whereas, The proposed work is not consistent with the City's Historic Design Principles;
